## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the shareholders of AIICO Pension Managers Limited

### Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of AIICO Pension Managers Limited (the company), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31st December 2019, and the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly in all material respects, the financial position of the Company as at 31 December, 2019 and of its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended and have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards, the relevant provisions of the Companies and Allied Matters Act, CAP C20 Laws of the Federation of Nigeria 2004, the Pension Reform Act 2014, the National Pension Commission (PENCOM) guidelines and the Financial Reporting Council of Nigeria Act No. 6, 2011.

#### Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and other independence requirements applicable for performing the audit of the company. We have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the IESBA code, and in accordance with other ethical requirements applicable to performing the audit of the company. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Other Information

The Directors are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the Directors' Report, the statement of Directors' Responsibilities in Relation to the Financial statements, the Value Added Statement and Five-Year Financial Summary as required by the Companies and Allied Matters Act, CAP C20 Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004, the Pension Reform Act 2014, the National Pension Commission (PENCOM) guidelines and the Financial Reporting Council of Nigeria Act No. 6, 2011. The other information does not include the financial statements and our auditors' report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express an audit opinion or any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

#### Responsibilities of the Directors for the Financial Statements

The Directors are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards, and the relevant provisions of the Companies and Allied Matters Act, CAP C20 Laws of the Federation 2004, the Pension Reform Act 2014, the National Pension Commission (PENCOM) guidelines and the Financial Reporting Council of Nigeria Act No. 6, 2011 and for such internal control as the Directors determine necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Directors either intend to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

#### Auditor's responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as going concern.

\* We communicate with the Directors regarding among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
